# MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION SESSER-VALIER COMMUNITY UNIT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 196 FEBRUARY 10, 2014 5:30 PM

### CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Board of Education of Sesser-Valier Community Unit School District No. 196 was held in the High School Library at 5:30 PM on Monday, February 10, 2014. The meeting was called to order by President Chris Gore.

Superintendent Henry indicated that to continue the Leadership Development Series, he is distributing for board review the established policies that address communication between the board and community and how complaints are to be submitted. He asked board members to review and indicated he would ask for questions and discussion at next meeting.

Superintendent Henry indicated that the district has now utilized three (3) Act-of-God days due to winter weather, and that those days would not be "made-up." He indicated that this situation causes a problem regarding hourly employees, and that he would address this issue after the likely season for winter weather had passed, and that he thought a solution could be easily reached.

Superintendent Henry then asked the board for feedback regarding what level of risk it is prepared to assume related to a proposed intergovernmental agreement for police service. Discussion followed regarding the need to keep everyone safe at the school and whether or not to assume liability risk for police actions. Superintendent Henry informed the board that the district's attorney has recommended to enter into an agreement only if a hold-harmless/indemnity clause protecting the district was part of the contract.

### **CONSENT AGENDA**

A motion was made by Kelly and seconded by Stacey approving the minutes of the previous meetings: January 13, 2014 (Regular Meeting) and January 13, 2014 (Board Policy Committee Meeting); Treasurer's report; the bills in the amount of \$133,091.13 and salaries in the amount of \$377,592.61; and approval of the new and/or revised board policies (final approval; effective March 1, 2014), as presented.
